Fort Lauderdale, Florida -Visit Pre or Post Cruise



According to the popular 1960 beach movie, Fort Lauderdale is "where the boys are." The city's reputation as America's Spring Break capital, however, has been replaced with the more favorable image of a prime family tourist destination, attracting more than 10 million visitors annually. The most popular beach resort in Florida is even more rightly famed as the "Yachting Capital of the World," with more than 40,000 registered crafts calling its waters home. The city also prides itself on being the "Venice of America" with more than 300 miles of navigable waterways. Fort Lauderdale boasts world-class theaters, museums, sightseeing, and shopping.

The city sits 24 miles north of Miami and is named after a series of forts built by the United States during the second Seminole War. The forts took their name from Major William Lauderdale, who was the commander of the detachment of soldiers who built the first fort. Look hard and you might find remnants of three of them today. More people seem to be interested in taking a water tour.

AMBER COVE, DOMINICAN REPUBLIC – Monday January 25, 2027 from 10am-5pm



Located in the Bay of Maimon, Amber Cove serves as a vital gateway connecting the Dominican Republic's North Coast to the global cruise industry. Since opening in 2015, this 25-acre port has welcomed millions of visitors, fueling economic growth, promoting sustainable tourism, and creating valuable opportunities for local businesses.

Tucked on the north coast of the Dominican Republic, Amber Cove, named for the translucent gemstone found on its shores, sits just seven miles from the town Puerto Plata, a cinematic locale used as the backdrop for the first Jurassic Park film. THINGS TO DO:

- **Puerto Plata -**
Famed for its sun-swept beaches, the resort destination of Puerto Plata also boasts a colonial-era center anchored by the 16th-century Spanish fortress Fortaleza San Felipe and the Amber Museum, where you can view specimens of the jewel.
- **Santiago -**
Dating back to the late 15th century, Santiago is the economic and cultural hub of the Dominican Republic. Admire the Caribbean Spanish architecture, photograph the Monument of Santiago and stroll Calle del Sol, the city's shopping district.
- **Ocean World -**
This must-see marine adventure park showcases the largest man-made dolphin habitat in the world. Here you can snorkel in the Reef Aquarium, feed exotic birds, walk through a tropical rainforest, watch a sea lion show, and much more.
- **Cultural Experience -**
The world's oldest cigar factory, visit a picturesque coffee plantation and explore a rum distillery. Photograph the 19th-century Cast Iron Lighthouse and admire the Victorian homes in Puerto Plata.
- **Beaches -**

Enjoy a myriad of activities at the public beach next to port or travel to one of several idyllic resorts and beach clubs with ample amenities.

- **Snorkeling -**

San Juan, Puerto Rico Tuesday, January 26, 2027 from 10am-6pm



One of the largest islands in the Eastern Caribbean, Puerto Rico's landscape encompasses mountains, underground caves, coral reefs, white-sand beaches and an incredibly massive rain forest that supplies fresh water to most of the island. At the same time San Juan, the capital of the commonwealth, is a big city with a bustling business district, glitzy resorts and casinos, as well as one of the most stunning examples of colonial life in the Western world.

THINGS TO DO:

- **Old San Juan -**
This 465-year-old neighborhood is a charming residential and commercial district. The streets are paved with blue cobblestones and feature restored Spanish-colonial buildings.
- **Fort San Cristobal -**
Built by the Spanish to defend San Juan from land invaders, this is the largest fortification constructed by Spain in the New World. At its completion in 1783, it surrounded the city of San Juan.
- **El Morro de San Felipe -**
This 16th-century citadel is a maze of tunnels, dungeons, barracks, outposts and ramps. Named after King Phillip of Spain, this six-level fortress guarded the bay from sea invaders.
- **Casa Bacardi -**
Home to the Bacardi family's extensive rum distillery, the visitor center has a fascinating tour with videos and olfactory exhibits, as well as a museum and replica of its very first distillery.
- **El Yunque National Rainforest -**
This region is made up of five different forests, including a cloud forest and a dwarf forest that is home to miniature trees as well as the island's rare tree frog.
- **Condado Beach -**
This peninsula of golden sand is a great venue to swim and sunbathe. Located just near the plaza, you can also shop or grab a bite to eat at the many cafes and hotels lining the strip.
- **Cultural & Botanical Gardens of Caguas -**
Puerto Rico has a perfect climate for growing some of the prettiest flowers and plants imaginable. This large park has many paths that let you meander.
- **Outdoor Adventure -**
Canopy ziplining, rainforest hiking, horseback riding, and kayaking are waiting for you.

Puerto Rico is a great place to enjoy authentic Spanish-style sangria and taste a wide array of delicious tapas.

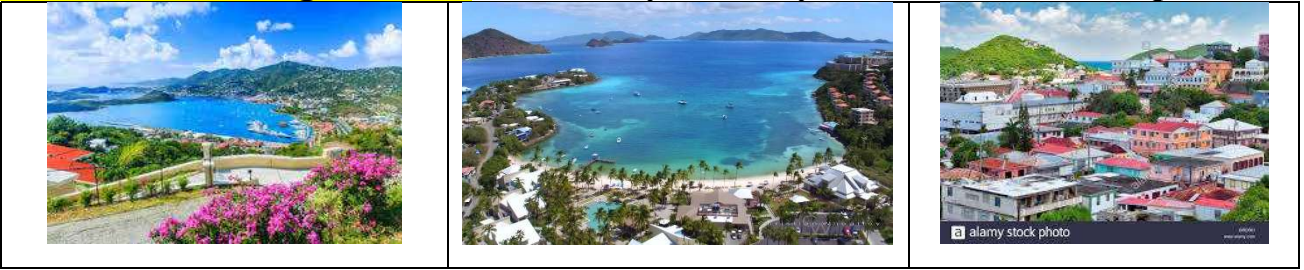

St. Thomas, US Virgin Islands Wednesday, January 27, 2027 from 8am-6pm



Cathy's Notes re Ship Dock: Ship usually docks (to be confirmed) at Crown Bay, which is about a 5 to 10 minute taxi ride to downtown Charlotte Amalie. Crown Bay features a recreated stone sugar mill in honor of the island's plantation era. Crown Bay Center businesses include jewelry, clothing and liquor stores. The Crown Bay Marina has a branch of Gourmet Gallery (and the ferry to Water Island leaves from there). You'll need to head downtown for serious shopping and dining. Adventurous types should be hesitant when wandering off the beaten path in Charlotte Amalie; crime can be an issue.)

The US Virgin Islands are America's paradise, offering an easygoing blend of island ways and American practicality. St. Thomas, capital of the island group, offers every imaginable sport: snorkeling, golfing, hiking, and sailing. Just a few miles away lay St. John and Virgin Islands National Park. Stunning mountain scenery, crystalline waters, and white-sand beaches with palms swaying in the breeze - the US Virgin Islands are truly a slice of paradise. The harbor is easily one of the Caribbean's most scenic. The United States purchased the Virgin Islands from Denmark for \$25 million in gold in 1917. St. Thomas has a reputation as a duty free-mecca for shopping.

- Magens Bay

One of the world's best beaches as selected by "National Geographic" magazine.

- Blackbeard's Castle

- Coral World

This 4.5-acre marine park offers an underwater observatory with 360-degree views of fish and other sea creatures, and the opportunity to pet sharks and hand feed stingrays.

- Mountain Top

This totally rebuilt mecca on top of a mountain, features souvenir shopping and excellent views of St. Thomas and its neighboring islands. It is considered to be the birthplace of the banana daiquiri. www.mountaintopvi.com

- St. John

The smallest of the U.S. Virgin Islands is only a 30-minute ferry ride away. Two thirds of the island is a national park. Annaberg Sugar Plantation Ruins and Trunk Bay are two favorite sights.

- Snorkeling & Diving

The island's underwater world is beautifully unveiled to both snorkelers and divers, exhibiting sunken boat wrecks, breathtaking coral reefs and a colorful spectrum of marine life,

Grand Turk, Turks & Caicos Friday, January 29, 2027 from 7am- 4pm



Grand Turk, the capital of the Turks and Caicos Islands, is a small island bursting with turn-of-the-century Caribbean charm, retaining the look and feel of the Caribbean 40 years ago. Grand Turk was founded by Bermudan salt rakers some three centuries ago and its Bermudan-British-colonial architecture surrounded by colorful local dwellings make the island a treasure to visit. It is recognized as being one of the first places in the New World where Christopher Columbus landed and also gained worldwide attention when John Glenn splashed down near Grand Turk on his historic first mission to space. Grand Turk is six miles long and just over a mile wide with a population of only 6,000. It is blessed with miles of uncrowded, beautiful beaches and is close to several uninhabited cays such as Gibb's Cay, home of the stingray encounter. While there are many landside attractions to explore such as the Old Prison, Lighthouse Park, and the re-created salt salina, the real beauty of the island lies underwater. Grand Turk is world-famous for its healthy and beautiful coral reefs that surround the island, stretching almost from the coastline to the 7,000-foot vertical wall just offshore.

THINGS TO DO:

- Cockburn Town: Historic 18th-and 19th-century Bermudian architecture lines the long, narrow streets of Cockburn Town, the administrative capital of Turks and Caicos.
- Turks & Caicos National Museum: The museum, located in one of the oldest stone buildings on the islands, chronicles Grand Turk's history from 700 A.D. to modern times and features artifacts from the Molasses Reef wreck.
- Grand Turk Lighthouse. More than 150 years ago, this lighthouse was brought from the U.K. to help halt shipwrecks on Grand Turk's reefs. Today, it's a prized historic site, protected by the National Trust.
- Gibb's Cay: The unspoiled, uninhabited island of Gibb's Cay is located about a mile from Grand Turk. A luxurious white-sand beach and fascinating snorkeling make this a favorite among visitors.
- Beaches: Enjoy one of Grand Turks' beautiful beaches.
- Snorkeling & Diving: The crystal-clear waters and underwater visibility are trademarks of Grand Turk.
- Outdoor Adventure: Grand Turk offers horseback riding, biking, dune buggies, kayaking - and even a Flowrider® near the pier.
